CHILDHOOD ACTIVITIES

With the support of the Arizona Friends of Foster Children Foundation, children choose activities and items to improve their experience in foster care, and we fund them. Kristin learned to swim, Anthony got math tutoring, and Grandma Kathy purchased a car seat, stroller and high chair when her granddaughter came into her care. These experiences and more were repeated 9,600 times for 4,769 different children and families in 2021.

Special Award Categories

As COVID-19 limited extracurricular activities for children and youth in foster care, AFFCF continued our special awards categories (Save Their Summer, Group Home Technology, and Holiday Gift Cards) to meet kids in foster care where they are. Aunt Theresa purchased outdoor games to keep her nephew active and safe in the midst of the pandemic. Jane made a positive memory with extra funds to make and share holiday treats. Even though he lives in a group home, Steven's grades are improving with access to one-on-one online tutoring with his teacher.

Being in foster care, there are so many things in Alex's life that are not normal. He sees his classmates playing sports and kids riding their bikes at the park. Awards from AFFCF help Alex feel more involved and included in activities. The simple gifts of a bicycle or soccer registration allow him be like every other kid.

After reviewing all the options, she decided that she wanted to enter the cosmetology field. Her dream was to one day own her own hair and nail salon. Her employment development specialist (EDS) help her practice interview skills to help her feel more comfortable and even drove her to apply for a job.

Today she is enrolled in a cosmetology program, studying to be a certified nail technician. She is working full-time to support herself while she attends school. Through the Keys to Success program, Aisha was able to address one obstacle at a time and create her own path to a successful future.

*In 2021, AFFCF entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Arizona Department of Child Safety to take part in the distribution of grant funding related to the Supporting Foster Youth and Families through the Pandemic Act (Division X of P.L. 116-120 Consolidated Appropriations Act (CAA). Under the MOU grants were made to eligible individuals to cover the critical financial needs of young adults who are or were in foster care including educational, child care, housing, transportation and other similar expenses. AFFCF is responsible for collecting applications for eligible individuals and then funding those grant requests according to very specific funding guidelines outlined in the MOU. Since AFFCF has no discretion over the use of the assets received, the transactions have been recorded as an agency transaction. During 2021, AFFCF received \$3.0 million in CAA funding and distributed \$2,433,086 to eligible beneficiaries. The remaining unspent funds of \$566,914 were recorded as a liability in the accompanying financial statements.
